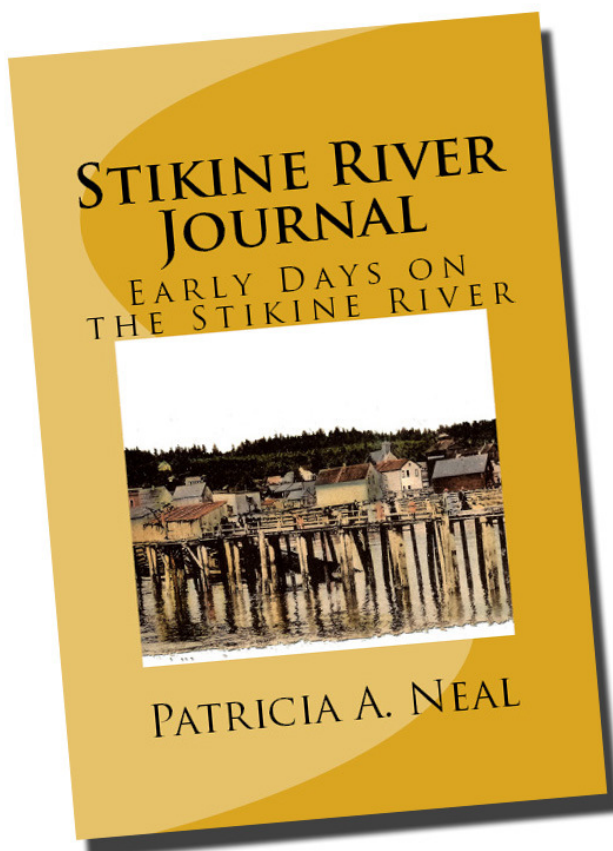

Written and compiled by former Wrangell resident and Historian, Trish Neal, the author has added other bits of historical information about Fort Wrangell and the Stikine River.

A brief overview of the history of Wrangell and the Stikine has been included to set the stage for the book.

The book has been illustrated with maps and photographs. The *Roster of Charter Members of Local Igloo Pioneers* is included. The book has been indexed to allow readers to easily look up names, place names, and subjects.
