

TRAIL BLAZING PLANE ON WAY TO NEW YORK.

SHIPS USED IN UNITED STATES AERIAL EXPEDITION TO ALASKA RETURN.

WRANGELL (Alaska) Sept. 10.—

Plane No. 4 of the United States Army's special expedition, returning to New York after a flight to Nome, Alaska, arrived at Sergeif Island, ten miles from Wrangell, late yesterday. Lieut. Ross Kirkpatrick, pilot, said he expected to make Hazelton by today.

Three other planes of the expedition encountered fog yesterday in attempting the flight from White Horse, Y. T., to Glenora, and were forced to return to White Horse. They will try to reach Glenora today if weather conditions permit, according to advices received here.

DAWSON (Y. T.) Sept. 10.—The Army airplane expedition returning to Mineola, N. Y., from its flight to Nome, Alaska, left White Horse yesterday for Glenora on the Stikine river, but encountering bad weather on Nakina Summit, three of the planes returned. It is believed the fourth plane went on to Wrangell or to the landing field at Glenora, which is ten miles from wire communication.

MOTORIST DROWNS IN COLORADO RIVER.

BLYTHE, Sept. 10.—An unidentified motorist, driving from Arizona into California, was drowned in the Colorado River near here today. He was crossing on the ferry from Ehrenburg, Ariz., when in some unexplained manner, his car was started and it leaped from the ferry into the river, about midway between the banks. The driver managed to free himself from the submerged car and started to swim ashore. He was caught by an undercurrent when a few feet from land and was swept under and drowned. A party was formed to hunt for the body. The car is embedded in mud in the river.

Mrs. Tony Seeley, wife of a rancher, was killed last night when she fell into an irrigation ditch and struck her head on a sharp projectile. Her body was recovered by her husband.
